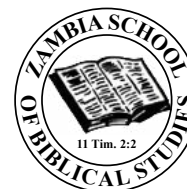

Since 1988 Livingstone, Zambia

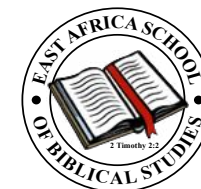

Since 2003 Busia, Uganda

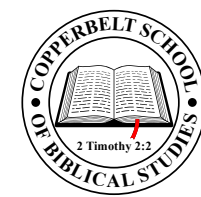
Unfortunately, we have still not finalized the legal issues in Uganda due to the deception and fraud of our former school director. While the courts affirmed our ownership of the property, delays continue, and the school remains closed. We've even had to hire 24/7 security to protect the site.

Despite this, evangelism continues through our faculty and 96 graduates. To keep training Ugandan men, we are opening a new school just across the border in Kenya. This will allow us to continue our mission until the situation in Uganda is fully resolved. We are committed to training faithful men from Uganda—many souls depend on it.
