



The Lord continues to bless our efforts in the training of faithful gospel preachers in Africa. Currently, there are five schools in session in Africa operating in Ghana, Zambia, and Kenya. On November 11th, Ray and I will travel to Ndola, Zambia and Nairobi, Kenya for two graduations and visit the two other schools in each of those countries. We are deeply thankful for the opportunity to witness firsthand how God's word continues to grow and transform lives across these nations.

First, we will visit the Copperbelt School of Biblical Studies in Ndola, Zambia, which will have its first graduation. Ten graduates will receive their associate degrees of biblical studies after two long years of studies. This will be the first graduation of this school which was started in February 2024. While in Zambia, we will also pay a short visit to the school in Livingstone. We currently have twenty-one students in Livingstone who are still in their first year of studies and are showing great promise and dedication in their learning and evangelism.

Next, our travels will take us to Nairobi, Kenya to attend the third graduation of the Kenya School of Biblical Studies. There will be fifteen men graduating in November. While in Kenya, we will also have a chance to visit the new school in Kisumu, Kenya, where twelve students are in their first year of studies. This school just started in August of this year and has already become a source of great encouragement to the local congregations.

We are very excited about this trip and about seeing all four schools, their instructors, and their students and look forward to meeting with some of the local brethren in the area. I am very excited about this mission trip because it will be the first one I have been able to go on in a while due to my need to care for my beloved wife, until her passing in May. She was always one who encouraged me to do the work and continue the work in Africa. It was our life together, and I know she would be thrilled to see the progress that continues today through the Lord's blessings.

There are always many costs involved in traveling to the schools in Africa to keep proper oversight. We are so blessed for all of you who continue to support the schools and our necessary travels. Our tickets and travel alone cost about \$7,000, not to mention expenses while there and also extra expenses related to the graduations themselves. As always, if you can help in any way it would be greatly appreciated and is much needed. You can make a donation online, or if you would like to send a check, just mark the donation as Mission Travel Expenses.

We appreciate you all and thank you so much for all you continually give to this work. It is only through special donations that we are able to keep all the schools in operation. At this time, the school in Nairobi is still short \$1,300 per month to cover operational expenses. Are you or your congregation interested in helping to fund this school and solidify our continued outreach in the evangelism of the world? May God continue to bless our efforts together for Him, not only in Africa but here as well, as we all strive to share the saving message of Christ.

#### Ndola, Zambia

There are many exciting things happening at the Copperbelt School of Biblical Studies. First, we have our first graduation about to take place in November of this year. There will be ten men graduating from the school, and we are excited about the future of the school and the great success it is having as it continues to grow in influence, touch many lives, and strengthen the Lord's church in this part of Zambia. It is truly encouraging to see God's work flourishing through these faithful students and teachers.



I am also very thankful for our faculty at the school. Our brothers Costain, Michello, and Ziko are all very good men and very serious about their work. They are really doing a great in teaching. administration, and

evangelism throughout the area. Their dedication to the truth has been a wonderful example to the students, surrounding congregations, and the many new believers they encounter each week. Their hard work and personal sacrifices continue to inspire everyone involved in the school's ministry.

On that compound was an old chicken house, which we were able to renovate and convert into a place for the congregation to meet. It has really worked out well, and today you wouldn't even know

that it had been an old chicken house. The church began worshiping in this new building in April.

Now fast forward to this month, and the church has a regular attendance of around fifty faithful and enthusiastic members. The name of the new congregation is the Kansenshi Church of Christ, and it is located not very far from the school in a growing and vibrant community. It also recently had its first gospel meeting. There were over twenty congregations from the area present, which is good, because liberalism has destroyed the area spiritually

in many ways. There were as many as 145 present, two baptisms, one restoration, and two who asked for prayers for health needs. What a great, wondrous, and encouraging blessing this is to be a part of such a powerful and uplifting work to the glory and praise of God.

Finally, we will be starting a new class in Ndola in February of

next year. The Copperbelt School plays an important role for the Lord's church in Northern Zambia. Little by little, we are beginning to encourage and challenge the many brethren in that area to return to the pure and simple gospel of God's Word. We are also reaching out to the many new souls who have never been touched with the saving gospel of Jesus Christ. Pray that the Lord will continue to give us the strength, wisdom, and opportunity to go unto the harvest in Zambia and to help people know Him, love Him, and desire His Word more deeply. For it is our God who truly gives the increase through the power of His eternal Word.
