## Springfield, Missouri

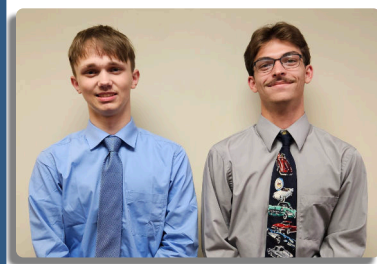

Second, on August 26 of this year, we will start a new school in Kisumu, Kenya. This school will primarily address our need to train more men from Uganda. We are excited about this new school and, Lord willing, will soon be training around fifteen men to become faithful preachers in the kingdom of God.

Third, as our work continues to grow, we have been able to secure a new laborer to join us. Brother Casey Rice will be joining our team. He is a graduate of Bible Institute of Missouri who has proven himself to be a great worker in the kingdom of God. Lord willing, on September 15<sup>th</sup>, He and his wife will move to Springfield and begin working with us. Brother Casey's work will focus on outreach and awareness for our ministry. He will ensure that GSOBS is promoted throughout the brotherhood and that our supporters are kept up to date.

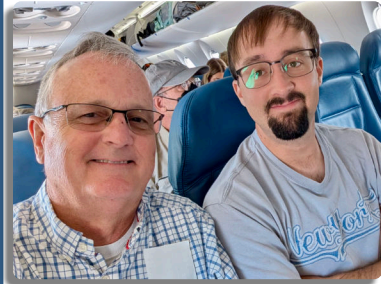

Kisumu is an excellent area for the school as it is easily accessible from other major cities and is also less than two hours away from where our school was located in Uganda. The transition to this location has been smoother than we anticipated, thanks to the warm welcome from the local brethren. As several of our brothers are busy with preparation for the new school, please keep these efforts in your prayers as we continue making preparations. Lord willing, on August 26, we will start a new class of around 15 students from Uganda and Kenya—more precious soldiers to which we can commit the word of God. Praise God for this new opportunity we have to do His will in Kisumu.

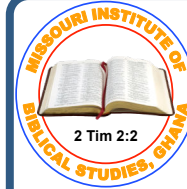
We also went to Livingstone, Zambia to check on the good work there. We currently have 21 men in their first year of studies in Livingstone. They are all doing a great job, and hopefully they will stay focused on their work and graduate at the end of next year. We have students from Zambia and Zimbabwe in this intake and will soon have a brother from Angola joining us as well. While in Zambia, we also heard all the current students preach and were very impressed with the good job they all did after only being in school for a few quarters. Our time in Zambia was truly a great time of fellowship, fun, and growth, and we were blessed to be with them to encourage one another. The dedication and spiritual maturity of these men continues to inspire us.

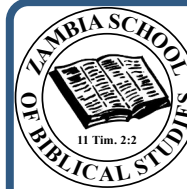
## Est. 2017 Kumasi, Ghana

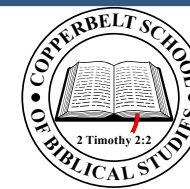

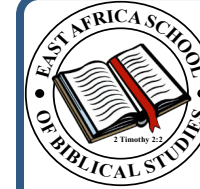


*Radio Program Evangelism*

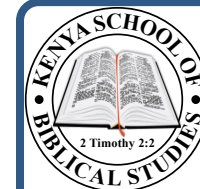


## Est. 2003 Busia, Uganda
