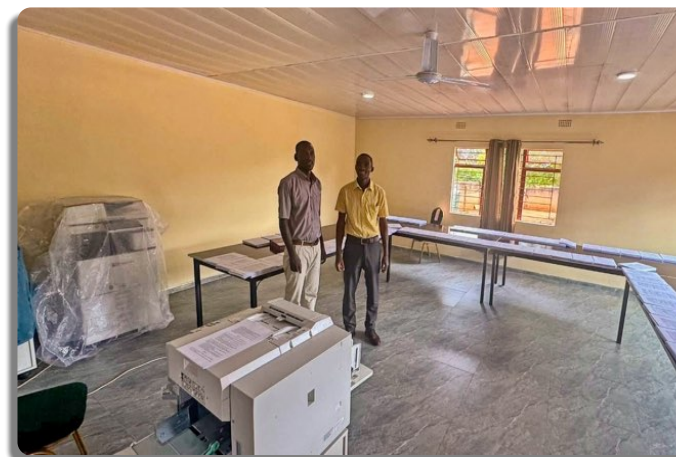


## GSOBS News

Greetings to all good brethren! This year is off to a great start and God continues to bless the Global Schools of Biblical Studies. Our schools of preaching are having a great effect in God's kingdom, not only here in the United States but also throughout Africa. At this time, we have over 80 men training to be soldiers in the army of the Lord. What a great blessing it is to be a part of such a great and far-reaching work of our God. Thanks to all of you for working with us and making all these things possible.

As you will see in more detail inside this report, this year there are many great events taking place. We have a new full-time print shop in Livingstone which is turning out a lot of great materials every day. We also have started two new classes at the schools in Kenya and Zambia. The school in Missouri will have a graduation in May. We also have two seminars for graduates planned this summer, and we will finish the year with two schools having graduations. God is so good, and great things are happening in Missouri and in Africa.



The Print Workshop Up and Running

There is also a lot of wonderful work being done in our new print workshop. We have been turning out a minimum of 200 completed books a week. These printings include textbooks used in all our schools and the schools of brother Ron Gilbert with International Bible Teaching Ministries. Recently, we printed 1,000 English songbooks, and we are now working on producing around 800 books in the four major languages throughout Zambia. In total, we are producing over 1,000 books a month, every month! We will also soon be printing tracts and many other religious tools for evangelistic use. Praise God for this new part of our work and for its great success. By the way, all this printing costs quite a bit of money, so we're working on getting the funding for this on a monthly basis. Through onetime contributions, we have been able to fund it so far, but as this is a permanent part of our work, we need to fund it with regularly committed funds as soon as possible. It will take about \$2,000 a month to support the print workshop, which can be paid monthly, or even annually if preferred. Please consider this great need which is accomplishing so much for the kingdom of God in Africa, and if you are interested or could help us fund this new part of the work, please let us know.

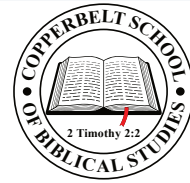


Shelf of Printed Materials

## Est. 2017 Kumasi, Ghana

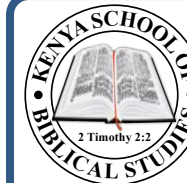

## Est. 2025 Kisumu, Kenya

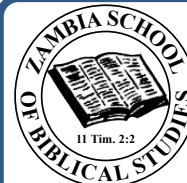

## Est. 1988 Livingstone, Zambia

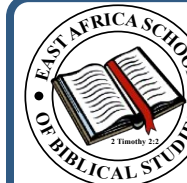
